Dear Parents of 2018-2019 Grade 4 Students:

The Abilene Independent School District and McMurry University will again partner in offering the Center for Innovation, a mathematics and science magnet school program for Grade 5 students during the 2019-2020 academic school year. This program offers enriched/enhanced opportunities in mathematics and science using the Grade 5 curriculum as set forth by the state as the foundation for the students' studies.

The group of selected Grade 5 students will attend school on the McMurry University campus and receive instruction from two full-time Abilene ISD teachers and a cadre of professors from the McMurry faculty. Through collaborative planning, the classroom teacher and McMurry professors will coordinate units of study in math and science. The classroom teacher will incorporate math and science connections in language arts and social studies units as well. Students will also receive instruction in music and PE as well as technology and library services. Technology will be incorporated into all areas of content study. As part of the program, students will participate in curriculum-related field trips and special math and science projects.

Admission is based on the following criteria:

- Be an enrolled, Abilene ISD student
- Have an interest in math and science
- Have satisfactory attendance with minimal tardies
- Have satisfactory conduct (citizenship grades on report cards and office referrals considered)
- Have at least a 90 average in the core subjects (language arts, math, science, social studies)
- Have passing scores on state assessments (Grade 4 STAAR Reading, Writing, and Math)

Students who meet the criteria will be admitted to a lottery pool. The goal of placement will be to have a balance of students representative of the District. Once the lottery pool has been established from the applications that meet the initial criteria, the lottery will be conducted. Students included in the lottery pool but not selected will remain in the pool in the event a selected student cannot attend. Due to the logistics of transporting small numbers of students from across the district, parents will be responsible for providing transportation to and from the school at McMurry University each day.

Attached to this letter is a copy of the Center for Innovation magnet program application, student/parent agreement, and student essay form. The completed application, student/parent agreement, and student essay must be submitted to Abilene ISD Office of Curriculum & Instruction, 241 Pine St., Abilene, TX 79601. **Applications are due by <u>May 15, 2019</u>**. The lottery will be conducted in mid-June. All applicants will receive notification of the lottery outcome by mail prior to June 28, 2018.

Parents who are interested in learning more about the program are invited to attend an informational meeting on **April 22, 2019**, at <u>6:00 PM</u> in the Board Room of the AISD Administration Building, 241 Pine Street.
