Summer School Guidelines

ELIGIBILITY

Students who were officially enrolled in the Abilene Independent School District as well as students from other school districts are eligible to attend summer school.

ABSENCE POLICY

At the High School level, any student with more than two absences per session will not receive credit. This is in accordance with the 90% attendance requirement. A student planning to attend summer school should not plan vacation time during the sessions. If a student acquires 2 absences in a semester (session) course, he/she will be subjected to loss of credit for that course with NO refund of tuition and will NOT be permitted to continue attending class.

TARDY POLICY

Because of the short length of class sessions and academic intensity of summer school, prompt and consistent attendance is required. Under the Discipline Management System of summer school, students who are persistently tardy to class may be dropped from attendance of summer school. Five tardies of fewer than 10 minutes each shall count as one absence and being late 10 minutes or more shall count as one absence.

REFUND POLICY

Students who are dropped for disciplinary reasons from enrollment in summer school or who have been dropped because of excessive tardies or absences will NOT be refunded any tuition or fee. Refunds cannot be made after the third day of classes. All requests must be approved by the administration.

DRESS CODE

All students attending summer school sessions in AISD schools will be subject to the dress code as well as the disciplinary policies of AISD. Students will be subject to removal from the summer school program WITHOUT a refund if referred to school administration more than twice.

COURSE SELECTION

Schedules are made by the administration based on enrollment. Courses cancelled due to insufficient enrollment will result in a refund or the opportunity for the selection of another course. Pre-AP/AP courses will not be offered.

IMPORTANT NOTE TO PARENTS

Please remember that Summer School Curriculum is presented at an extremely intense pace in order to cover the state required Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) in a limited time period. ALL students enrolled in Summer School courses will be expected to master at least 70% of the material presented.

GPA and CLASS RANKING

Traditional (teacher-led) summer school courses will be considered for credit and used in determining grade point averages and class rankings. Online acceleration courses are offered as pass/fail and are not used in class rank/GPA.
