



Criteria Rankings

The committee ranked the following criteria, which will be weighted as follows. This will later be used in the prioritization of potential projects:

- 1. Urgency/Need 30%
- 1. Benefit to Students 30%
- 2. Attracting/Retaining Students 20%
- 3. Value 15%
- 4. Equity 5%




