Liverpool Echo</li> <li>Points to Emphasize <ul> <li>Coordinate adjectives appear in sequence with one another and modify the same noun.</li> <li>They are separated by commas, and and may come before the final adjective.</li> <li>If you are uncertain deciding whether a group of adjectives are coordinating, try inserting and between them. If and works, the adjective is coordinate and hence you do need a comma.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Examples: In the attic, we found old, thin paper cutouts we used to play with when we were children. The poster depicted a brown-haired, blue-eyed child wearing a red denim shirt. <b>Your turn:</b> My sister is a, , and family member. <b>Points to Emphasize</b> First, try placing the word "and" between the two adjectives.
