Clinical Rotations

• In the Spring, students participate in a clinical rotation at a site of their choice



- Students select an area of interest and obtain permission to attend at their site
- On-the-job training could lead to a certification or possibly a job
- Rotations 3 times a week for 5 weeks

• Sites will not include hospitals (unless a CNA)

 Attendance is taken each rotation visit and students will be required to submit a clinical report each week



- Students need to provide their own means of transportation to the sites
- Clinicals are a privilege, not a guarantee

One set of scrubs per student will be provided:


- scrub vendor will go with Mrs Walker to CHS & AHS
