HOLLAND REQUIREMENTS

- Malpractice insurance is a requirement of all healthcare professionals and students
- The district takes out a blanket insurance policy to cover the students
- Each student is responsible for their portion of the insurance
- This will be collected the first week of school

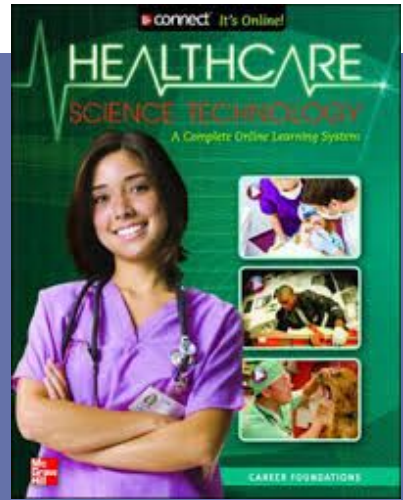

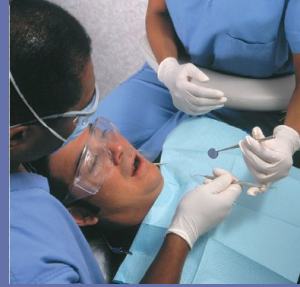
ONLINE TEXTBOOK

- Make sure to plan for this – it will require self-motivation, organization, and internet access!



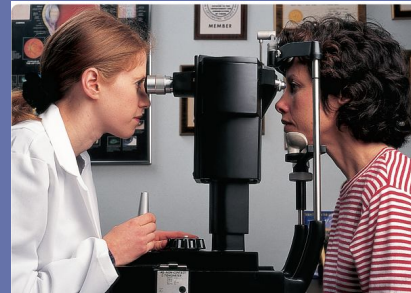

Clinical Rotations

CLINICAL ROTATIONS

- In the Spring, students participate in a clinical rotation at a site of their choice 
- Students select an area of interest and obtain permission to attend at their site 
- On-the-job training could lead to a certification or possibly a job 
- Rotations 3 times a week for 5 weeks

CLINICAL ROTATIONS

- Sites will not include hospitals (unless a CNA)
- Attendance is taken each rotation visit and students will be required to submit a clinical report each week
- **Students need to provide their own means of transportation to the sites**
- Clinicals are a privilege, not a guarantee

Dress Code

One set of scrubs per student will be provided:

- scrub vendor will go with Mrs Walker to CHS & AHS
- students will try on samples for correct sizing
- projected April/May timeframe
- Mrs. Gates & Mrs. McMillion will be informed when we will be there during lunches
- extra set of scrubs is optional (\$29)
- scrub jackets are also optional (\$20)
- extra patches are \$5.50

- Jewelry:
 - Dress code for clinical sites: Holland  scrubs, patch, ID, and appropriate shoes (all **white** or all **black**, leather or imitation leather, non-mesh)
- Clinical attire will also be worn on  some lab days and guest speaker days

CLINICAL DRESS CODE

- Jewelry:
 - one set of studs (non-jeweled) and a wedding ring or engagement ring 
 - no necklaces, bracelets, or piercings of any kind may be worn (other than studs)
- All tattoos must be covered 
- No artificial fingernails are allowed during rotations
- Natural-looking hair and make-up 


DRESS CODE

- Dress code for class is the same as for the home campus - this is enforced
- Scrub days when we practice certain skills or have guest speakers
- Professional Dress Days:
 - job interview preparation
 - students dress professionally
 - grades will be taken
